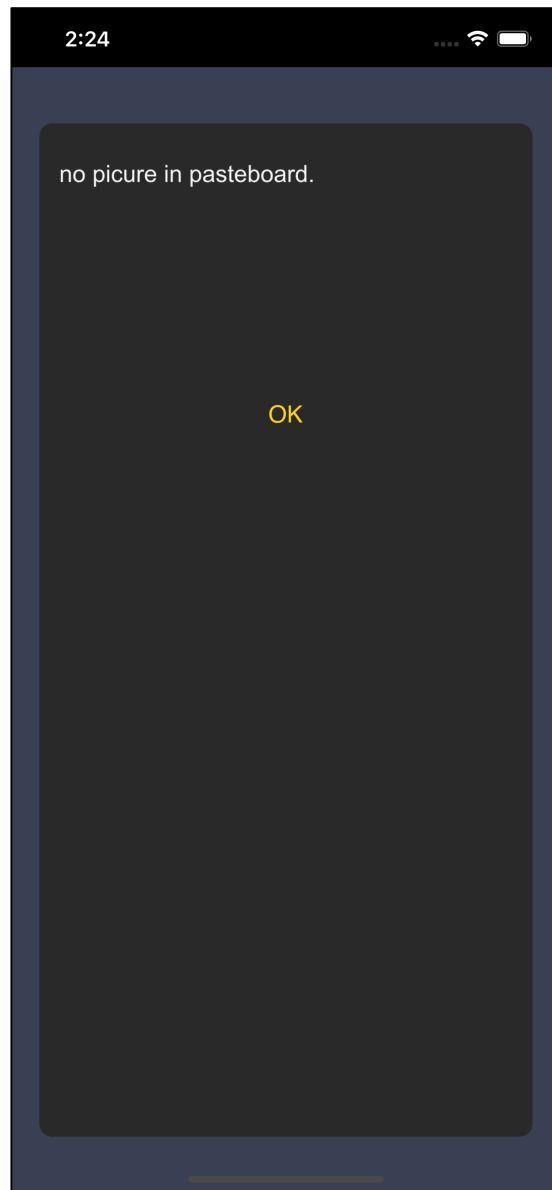
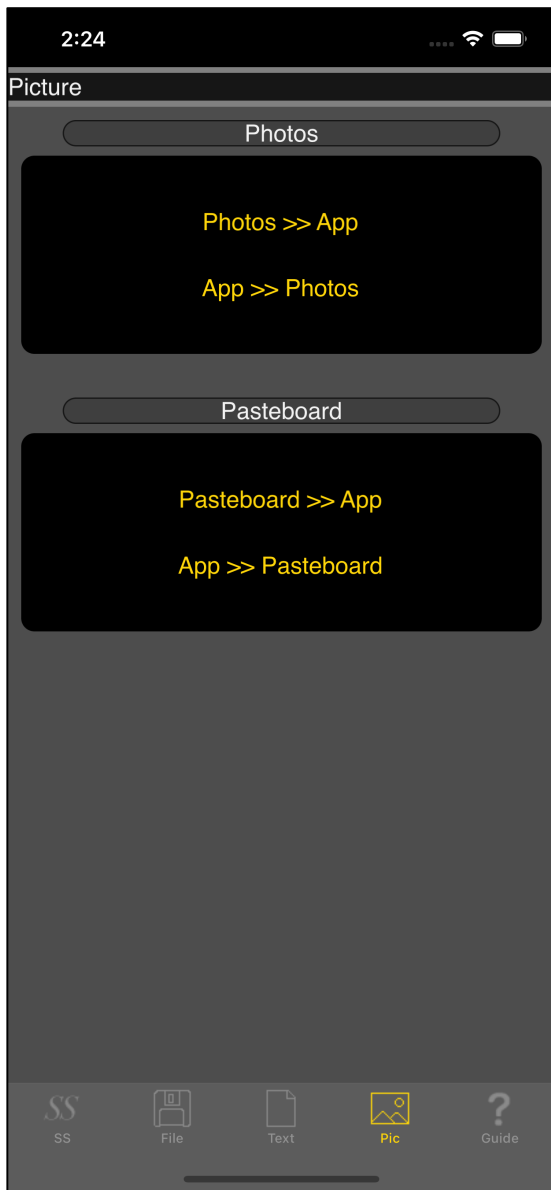


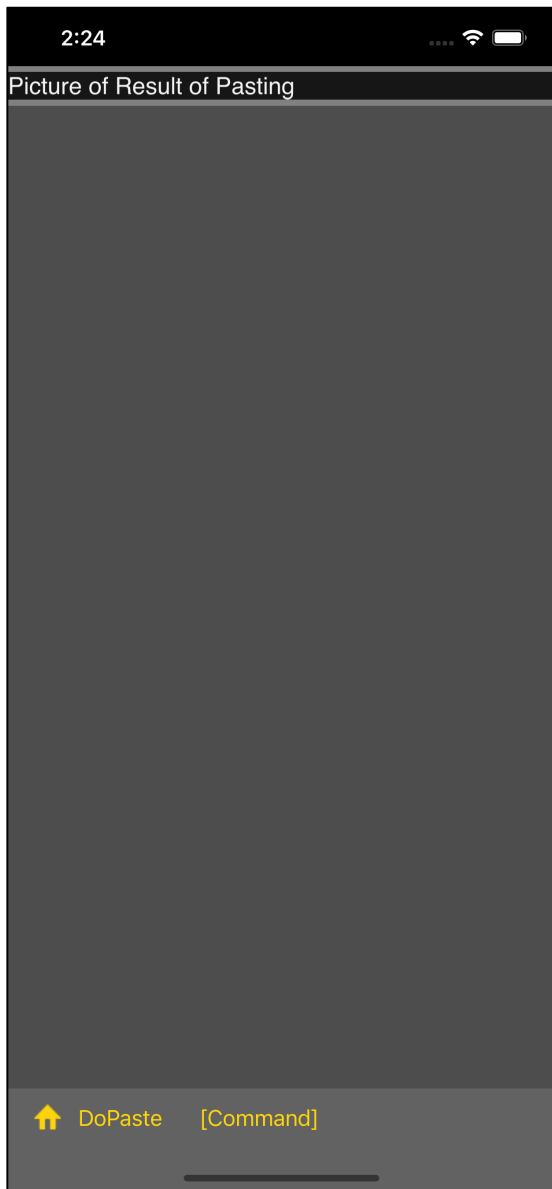
Paste from Pasteboard



The third button, "Pasteboard >> App" (Paste from Pasteboard), is a command to get an image of Pasteboard.

When you press the "Pasteboard >> App" button, if there is no image on the Pasteboard, you will see a message like the one on the right.

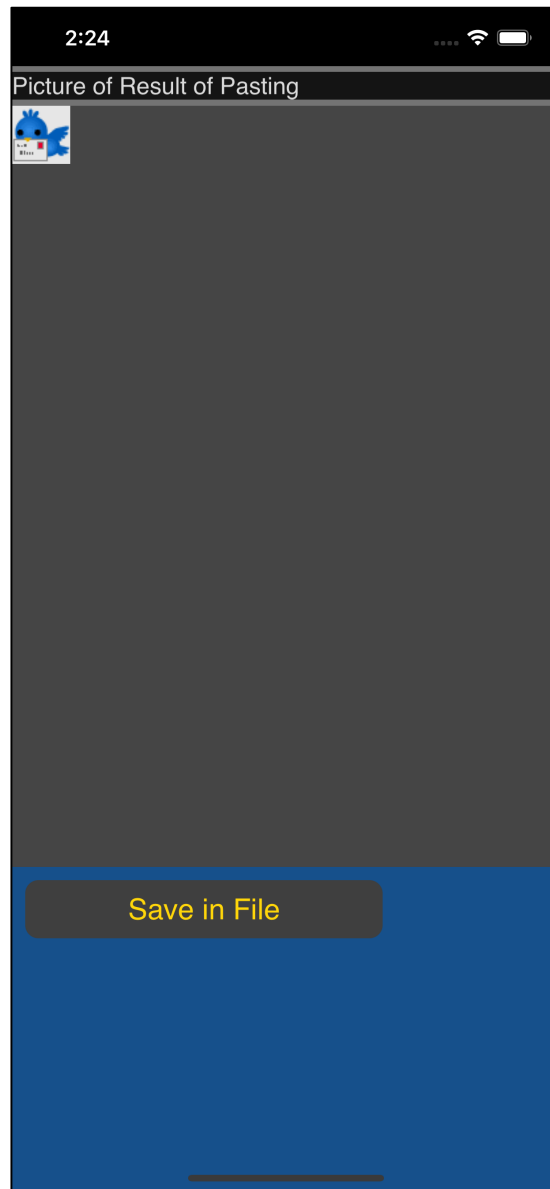
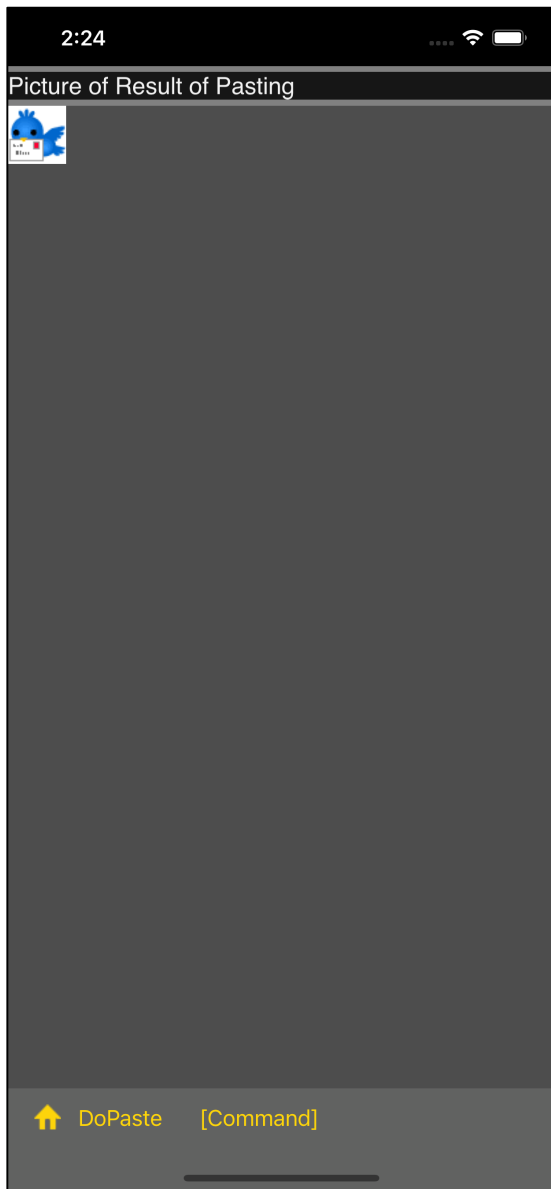
If the Pasteboard has an image, the view below is displayed.



This view is a view that displays an image.

At first, the image to display is not loaded, so it is blank.

Press the "DoPaste" button on the toolbar to paste the pasteboard image into the image view.



The figure on the left is just after being pasted.

This state is simply displaying the pasted image.

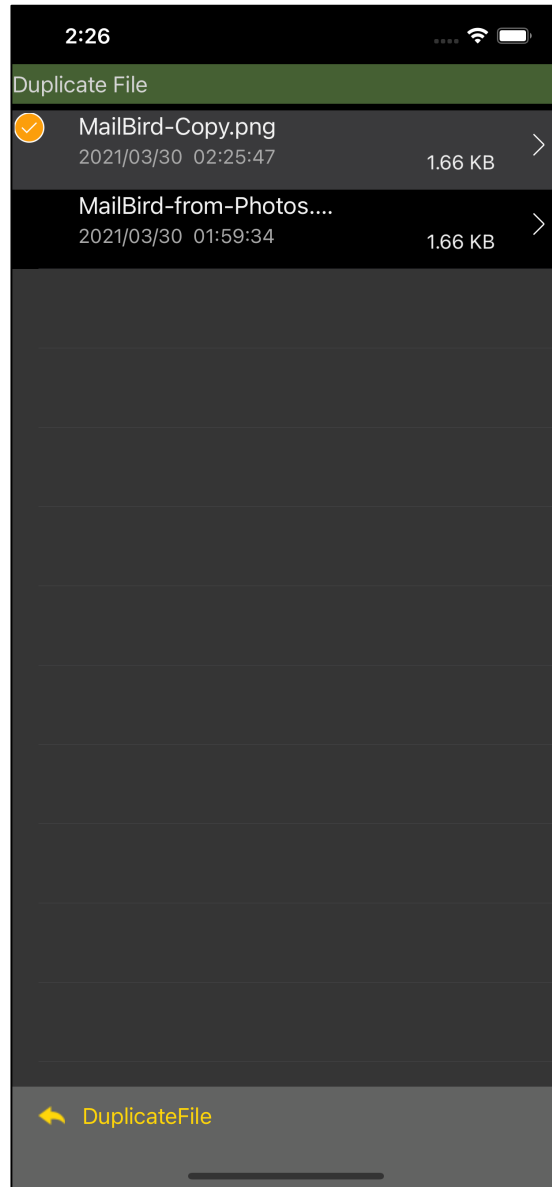
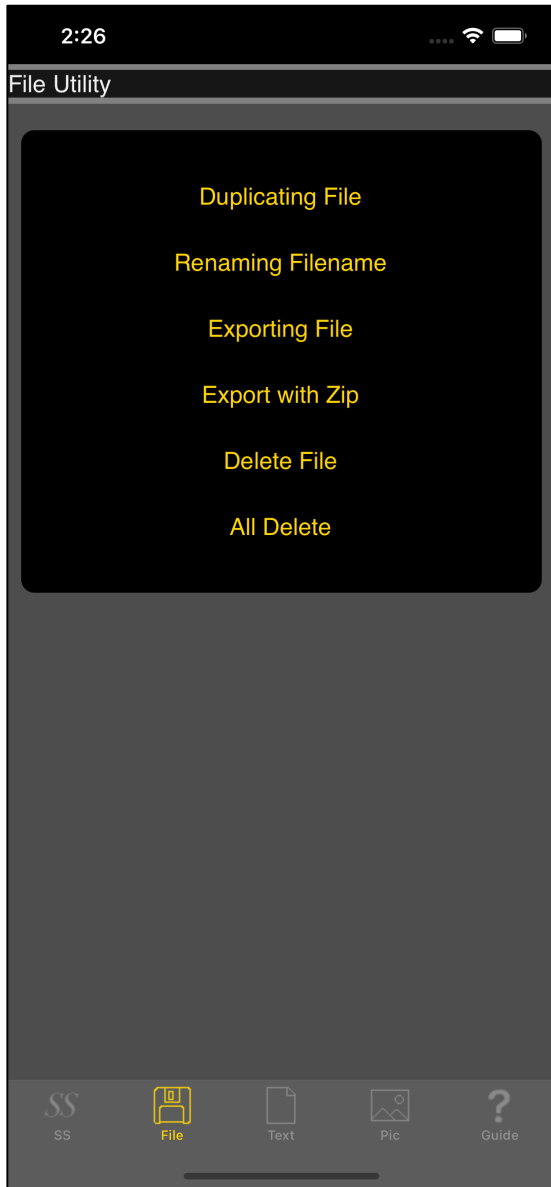
When you press the [Command] button on the toolbar, the pop-up menu as shown on the right pops up from the bottom.

This is the command for the displayed image.

When you click the "Save in File" button on the pop-up menu, the following view for entering a file name will appear.



In this way, when you enter the file name and press the "DoSave" button on the toolbar, it will be saved as a png file.



This is what happens when you use the "Duplicating File" command to see what you have saved in the file.

Press the arrow button on the far right to display the next view.
